

Filipendula 'Red Umbrellas'

Large maple-shaped leaves of green are he veined with maroon. In early summer plants are topped with umbels of pink, fluffy flowers. Shorter than typical meadowsweet. Prefers moist soil. Zone 3



Coreopsis v. Cruizin' 'Broad Street'

Bright red flowers with orange on the underside of the petals. This threadleaf Coreopsis is one of five colours in the Cruizin' Series. Grow in a sunny well drained location. Plants grow 40-50cm tall. Zone 5.

Hosta 'Little Treasure'

Miniature Hostas are ideal for containers, rock gardens or Fairy gardens. Little Treasure has thick white leaves that are slightly wavy and have a wide blue-green margin. Hostas are happiest in a shadier garden. Zone 3.

Heuchera 'Forever Purple'

glossy leaves with fluted edges and great vigor. Very short spikes of purple-pink flowers in summer and four seasons of purple. A real show stopper. Zone 4

Gaura lin. 'Sparkle White'

Sparkle White produces long panicles of starry white flowers to decorate the garden from late spring to autumn. All-America Selections Award Winner for 2014. Prefers a sunny, well drained location. Zone 4



Gaillardia 'Sunset Snappy'

Gaillardia Sunset Snappy has rows of pink petals with cream/yellow tips. Blooms are colourfast and age well over an exceptionally long period. Gaillardia are drought tolreant once established. Zone 5



Agastache 'Kudos™ Mandarin'

s is a real workhorse in the gard lowering nonstop from midsummer well into the autumn and it's easy to grow. Upright spikes of bright orange, fragrant plumes. Great in containers or in a mixed border. Must have excellent drainage. Zone 5

Chelone I. 'Tiny Tortuga'

A very compact selection growing just 30-40cm tall. Forms clumps of glossy dark green foliage with reddish stems and hot pink flowers, very strong branching habit. Prefers a moist location. Zone 3

Brunnera mac. 'Alexander's Great'

gigantic mound of very large, heart-shaped, heavily silvered leaves. Sprays of blue Forget-me-not flowers appear in spring. Keep out of hot afternoon sun. Zone 4

Festuca glauca 'Beyond Blue

An improved selection that forms a dense tuft of bluer-than-blue leaves that remain blue all season. Excellent in containers or mass planted as a mounding groundcover. Best in a sunny garden. Zone 4



Echinacea Sombrero™

Adobe Orange
The latest in the Sombrero™ series, this very well-branched Echinacea is compact and prolific. Warm adobe orange blooms are produced all summer. Proven hardiness for years of enjoyment in the garden. Zone 4



Delosperma Wheels of Wonder® 'Hot Pink Wonder'

This hardy Ice Plant has larger flowers and is longer blooming than other varieties. Bright pink blooms on a versatile plant that is happy in containers as well as a sunny garden. Zone 5

Hosta 'Vulcan'

An exceptional Hosta, 'Vulcan' is a vigorous, white centred sport of Captain Kirk. This large plant grows 60cm tall by 90cm wide and resists fading. Zone 3.

Helleborus 'Tutu'

The Lenten Rose is an easy spring bloomer for the shady woodland garden. This selection has flowers of medium pink, with a small double anemone-style centre crowned in a tuft of yellow. Evergreen. Zone 4

Carex o. Evercolor® 'Everillo'

Sedges are grass-like plants, mostly preferring sites with moist, rich soil. This selection forms a cascading mound of bright, lime-green leaves that turn yellow-gold as they mature. Outstanding evergreen foliage plant. Zone 5

Lavandula 'Big Time Blue'

This Lavendula is the earliest blooming angustifolia variety by far! The flowers spikes are also larger than on Lavender Munstead or Hidcote. Very compact plant. Prefers full sun and excellent drainage. Zone 5.



Hosta 'Cracker Crumbs'

Miniature Hostas are ideal for containers, rock gardens or Fairy gardens. Cracker Crumbs has wavy chartreuse-yellow leaves that are ners, rock edged in dark green. Hostas are happiest in a shadier garden. Zone 3.



Lithodora 'Crystal Blue'

This new selection boasts large, impressive sky blue flowers. Lithodoras are great for rock gardens or as a groundcover in any sunny, wel drained garden. Zone 5

Sedum Sunsparkler 'Firecracker'

Sedum Firecracker turns heads with red foliage and hot pink flowers that stand up to the heat beautifully. A compact selection at 15cm high and 30cm wide. Zone 3

Nepeta 'Candy Cat'

This Catmint forms a bushy mound of fragrant, glossy green leaves, bearing heads of tubular pale, lavender-pink flowers late spring through late summer A good mid-border selection, also excellent in containers. Zone 4.



Dicentra 'Love Hearts'

Gorgeous heart-shaped white flowers with purple tips. Dense flower clusters on gracefully arching stems continue to bloom throughout summer. Attractive finely cut blue-gray foliage. Hardy to zone 5.



Phlox pan 'Laura'

Summer Phlox is very popular for its late summer display in the border. Laura has large clusters of fragrant flowers with purple petals and a white eye. Good for cutting. Attracts butterflies. Hardy to zone 3.



Leucanthemum 'Whoops-a-Daisy

This dwarf shasta daisy features multiple layers of frilly, pure white petals surrounding a gold centre. The plant forms a dense, ballshaped mound of dark green leaves. Blooms age well and are carried on very strong stems. Attractive to butterflies. Zone 5.

Salvia nem. 'Blue Marvel'

Salvia Blue Marvel has ultra-large flowers that are the biggest of any S. nemorosa. A premium perennial, this deserves a spot in the garden as well as in the garden centre. 30cm X 30cm.

Gaillaria 'Celebration'

Gaillardia 'Celebration' has a single row of elegant red petals carried on very strong stems. Blooms are colourfast and age well. 'Celebration' blooms over an exceptional long period. Ideal for containers, beds and borders Zone 5.



Clematis 'Samaritan Jo™'

A Clematis with a distinctly different flower with light purple edges. Prolific and long blooming this Clematis only grows 4-5' tall. Best in a sunny location. Hardy to zone 4.



Dianthus sunflor 'Luigi'

A brand new range of Carnations. This selection features salmon coloured, fragrant flowers on short, sturdy stems. Excellent for containers, rock gardens and borders. Drought tolerant and easy to grow. Prefers well-drained soil in sun or part shade. Evergreen. Zone 4.



Veronica a. 'Venice Blue'

Venice Blue has the largest flowers in its class, with a deep blue colour. Spires are short but multi-floral. This Veronica is an easy-to-grow, early Spring-flowering, heat-loving perennial. Hardy to zone 4.



Hosta 'Calypso'

A nice small Hosta at under 30cm tall, Hosta Calypso has narrow white leaves with a green edge. The healthy mounding habit is ideal along a pathway or in a container with some ferns. Zone 3.



Agastache 'Blue Boa'

Unlike any other Agastache. Deep violet-blue flower spikes held over ultra green foliage. Winner of the "Too Good To Wait Performer" award at the 2013 Colorado State Perennial Trials. Fragrant, drought tolerant and a magnet for butterflies. Zone 5.

Silene robotii 'Streaker'

This exciting sport of Silene 'Rolly's Favorite' exposes itself with shocking variegated foliage Yellow/chartreuse streaks randomly highlight the green foliage. Hot pink blooms are an added bonus. Very long bloomer. Zone 5.



Perovskia a. 'Crazy Blue'

a bushy clump of fragrant grey-green leaves, bearing copious spikes of purple-blue flowers from late spring on. This selection was bred to stand up through wind and rain. Great for hot, sunny sites. Zone 4.

Echibeckia 'Summerina Orange'

An intergeneric cross between two popular perennials offering the appearance of Rudbeckia with the hardiness of Echinacea. Plants offer a long bloom season from summer through fall and extra large flowers. Zone 5
